





Let's Start at the Very Beginning...

- The Dutch invented the orange carrot. (Orange is the "official" color of the country).
- There are over 1,000 historic windmills there.
- They are super tall people.


The Dutch Canal System

- Waterkaart app to navigate the canals.
- Canals are clean and less weedy than other countries.
- 6000km of canals in a country that is continually adding more land.
- Can access all of Europe using canals.
- Netherlands doesn't require the RYA International Competency Certificate (aka "ICC") but it probably will in the future. The rest of Europe does require the ICC.
- Dutch people are very helpful and friendly, but direct (they will tell you that you have something in your teeth when your best friend wouldn't have told you).
- Bridge heights and depths are in DECI meters (NOT meters).
 This means height of 36.5 is 3.65m. Power line heights are in meters.
- Friesland is boater's paradise (see light green area in the northwest, to the left).

Fryslân - Our "Home"

- Friesland is one of 12 provinces in the Netherlands.
- The boat-centric population is about 660,000 people.
- The area has been occupied since the 4th century BC.
- Frisians are like Texans in that they consider themselves their own country.
- Friesland is situated above 53 degrees latitude, so in the summer the sun sets around 11:30pm and comes back up around 4:00am.
- Frisian people are exceptionally tall (this is referenced in Dante's *Divine Comedy*).
- There is a famous ice skating race that goes to the oldest "eleven cities" called the Elfstedentocht.
- Those are not hearts on the flag. They are "pompeblêden" (lily pads), and they reference the Frisian "sea countries" from the Middle Ages.




- Full Service Yards to store your boat in the off season.
- They work on our boat during the 9 months we are not there.
- We're on our 3rd yard in 2 years, and we found our perfect place.
 - Woman owned boatyard.
 - Incredibly clean and well run yard.
 - We can work on our own boat and stay in the B&B on the property if we can't stay on the boat.
 - We can pull into the yard during the season to fix things.
 - There is a horse ("Tender") and a dog ("Fender") to pet.
- Cost for storage is around \$1200/year (this is for the 9 months we are not in Europe).
- Be ready to be surprised by the hourly yard rate.









- ~12 hours to Amsterdam from SFO
- Dutch train system rocks.

 2.5 hours to Grou with a switch in the middle
- NO UBER! WhatsApp the only taxi driver in Grou (Atiq) and he meets us at the station. (Hint: everyone in the rest of the world uses WhatsApp)
- Pick up boat at yard and motor 35 minutes to Grou marina
- Sleep off some jet lag, then provision the next day at the Jumbo grocery store (see left, it has a dock!)

How We Cruise



- Plan to arrive when everyone else is leaving after breakfast to get a parking spot if going to a Passantenhaven
 - "Passantenhaven" means "marina", and most marinas cost 16-20€ for the evening.
 - If you need to fill your water before you leave, start early. It takes us about an hour to fill our water tanks.
- Keep all your 1 and 2 Euro coins, because you will need them for showers, laundry and bruggeld or sluisgeld.
- We motor ~4 hours per day so we have time to wander around the next destination.
- Many bridges and locks have lunch hours and are not open between 12-1p.
- Camera bewaking bridges will not open if it's a button bridge. Bridgekeepers in small towns operate ALL the bridges in the town, and ride a bike alongside you to get to the next bridge.
- It's very important to understand that spring lines should be first on.
 - We've seen many people end up sideways because they tied their bow or stern on first.
- You need a VHF radio license to use it in the Netherlands. You don't really need a VHF.
- In the far north (above Leeuwarden), there are still a lot of places that don't take credit cards. That seems to coincide with more people who don't speak English.







We got a free gift bag

- It's advanced boat handling gone wild in the eastern part of the Netherlands.
- Limited length, width and height for boats due to bridges and very thin canals. Must be an "expert" boat handler, they say.
- Turf = peat, and peat was used in the 16th century to heat houses in Amsterdam.
- Most tourists (and even some residents) have never been there, and since the info is all in Frisian, most tourists have never heard of it.
- The town name "Donkerbroek" actually translated to "Dark Pants" (and they are proud of this).



"De Rat" molen is a working windmill/sawmill Built in the 17th century











Friesland Favorites - Fierljeppen









- Fier = "far", ljeppen = "leaping"
- Pole is 26-43 feet long
- Originally just a way to get around the waterways and leap over small water channels
- First official match in 1771





Friesland Favorites - Stavoren

- Granted city rights in 1060
- Burial place of early kings of Friesland
- Declined in the Middle Ages when a sandbank formed in the harbor, keeping ships from entering
- One of the stops on the Elfstedentocht.
- Sits right on the Ijsselmeer and would be where we would leave from to get to the other side of Netherlands.

Friesland Favorites - Dokkum









- Northernmost of the 11 cities and a fountain city
- Turnaround point for Elfstedentocht
- Fortified city, population 12000+
- Smallest hospital in the Netherlands
- On the Standing Mast Route to the North Sea
- Hondenweer means "raining dogs"


Charter!

There are charter companies all over Friesland. The ones we see a lot include *HW Yachtcharter* in Grou, *Yachtcharter* in Terherne, *Yachtcharter* in Sneek and *Aquanaut* in Sneek. (See the bridge height slide for *Le Boat* information...). A 9 meter boat will be comfortable for a couple for a week.



Cruise

If you charter, you are welcome to cruise along with us, or meet us in various places along the way. We can help you sort out a float plan after you have set up your charter, and other details in order to get you to your boat.



Buy

You could be irresponsible (like us) and just buy a boat. We recommend spending a week or two in the Netherlands, looking at various boats. Make sure you spend time looking at https://botentekoop.com (their version of Yacht World). (The URL literally means "boat for sale").



Insure

The most difficult part of owning a boat in Europe is finding insurance. Most insurers do not want to insure people who do not have a European address. Or Americans. They have a thing about insuring Americans.



Fly

This is the most expensive part of the trip. Once you are there, everything costs less!
